Highlight of the Quarter: Sea Level Rise Workshop at Sams House at Pine Island

Marking the third iteration of the FPAN Sea Level Rise Workshop, staff worked in partnership with Brevard County Environmentally Endangered Lands (EEL) managers and other professionals in the field to host the public for a day-long workshop that discussed the impacts of climate change on Florida's cultural resources. Staff spoke to a packed house at the historic Sams House site, a pioneer homestead now part of an EEL preserve that also serves as a cultural interpretation center.
