

Outreach: CRPT Workshop in partnership with Florida Historical Society

East Central Regional Staff conducted the second CRPT workshop in Eau Gallie. FPAN partnered with the Florida Historical Society who hosted the workshop at the historic Rossetter House Museum. For the afternoon portion the group worked in the Houston Cemetery where they cleaned markers with D-2, recorded condition forms, and monitored the site. The last workshop at this cemetery was in 2013, was a great opportunity to repeat the offering for new staff, stewards, and students in the area.
