Third Quarter Highlight: Addressing the Archaeological Heritage of All Florida Communities: Archaeobootcamp at the Jupiter Inlet Lighthouse Outstanding Natural Area

In March, FPAN SE staff completed their 6th annual Archaeobootcamp at the Jupiter Inlet Lighthouse and Museum in Jupiter, Florida. This program is an alternative spring break geared towards exposing university students to different aspects of careers in

archaeology. The program is funded by award from the Bureau of Land Management—Eastern States. FPAN staff from all over the state attended the program, including Executive Director Dr. Mary Furlong-Minkoff. Participants came from all over Florida and Georgia, and learned archaeological techniques including excavation, transect mapping, photogrammetry, ground penetrating radar (GPR), and terrestrial laswer scanning. The program also included a public event and Careers in Archaeology Public Panel.




Photo 2: Baseline offset mapping from historic seawall at Jupiter Inlet Lighthouse Outstanding Natural Area

Third Quarter Highlight: RPA Certified Field School at the Jupiter Inlet Outstanding Natural Area

Every Monday January through April, 16 learners participated in FPAN SE's archaeological field school at the Jupiter Inlet Outstanding Lighthouse Natural Area. This program is sponsored by an agreement with the Bureau of Land Management. Participants in the program this year included students from FAU, FIU, and UNISA, as well as lifelong learners who were members of the local community. Over the course of the 12-week program, participants learned basic skills for a career in archaeology, including planning a phase I survey, excavating shovel test pits, and basic artifact processing and cataloguing. The program also featured guest lectures like above, where Eden Brazil (NPS) and Blair Moore (UM) led an underwater archaeology workshop including baseline offset mapping.
